Invite guest speakers, artists, environmentalists to speak to children

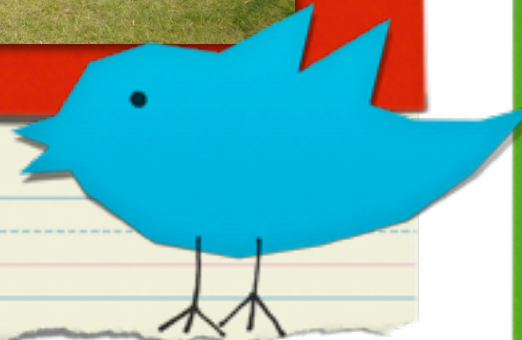
Celebrate Zambian holidays and events
